Should school textbooks be replaced by notebook computers?

[1] In recent years, there has been heated debate on whether students in Hong Kong should use notebook computers instead of printed textbooks in schools. There are always two sides to a coin. This article will explore the two opposing views in this debate.

[2] Those who are in favour of this argument, such as technological advocates, believe that Hong Kong schools should follow this global trend. They believe that students can learn technology skills in this way. Environmentalists also believe that this is an environmentally friendly proposal as it can unquestionably save paper. Parents also welcome this decision because the replacement can help reduce the weight of their children's schoolbags. Although notebook computers still carry certain weight, they are no doubt lighter than a dozen textbooks. This will be beneficial to the children's physical development.

[3] There are also criticisms to the use of e-books. Many teachers disagree to the use of notebook computers because they are worried that students may be distracted by this gadget. For instance, students may browse other sites or use software which is irrelevant to the teaching content. It then will be difficult for teachers to manage the classroom. 'I am concerned about the learning attitude among students. From my experience, learning is more effective if students can use their pens and pencils and do highlighting on printed books rather than simply clicking a few buttons on the keyboard,' said Ms Ivy Tam, an experienced teacher. 'I am worried about teachers' readiness,' admitted Ms Kwan, a school principal. 'You know, we have a lot of experienced teachers who are in the field for over 20 years. They have been using printed books since their first day of teaching. It will be a drastic change if printed books are replaced.'

[4] Obviously, there are pros and cons to this issue of concern. Having taken into consideration different parties' perspectives, there is still a way out. If schools can consider letting students use both e-books and printed books, both teachers and students can be allowed more time to get used to different modes of learning. After all, this change should not happen overnight but gradually.

Should school textbooks be replaced by notebook computers?

[1] Notebook computers are becoming increasingly prevalent in higher education around the globe. A heated debate has been formed over whether Hong Kong schools should follow this global trend by switching from printed textbooks to digital textbooks on notebook computers. While some people think that the use of e-books will benefit both students and teachers, some
5 are concerned about a number of side effects it might bring. Obviously, there are two sides to a coin. Let's take a look at both sides of the argument.

[2] Those who are in favour of this argument believe that different parties will benefit from the use of notebook computers in the classroom. Proponents believe that utilizing portable computers in the classroom can equip students with technology skills, which can better prepare
10 them for a world immersed in technology. Some teachers advocate for the change as they find that the use of notebook computers can enrich the classroom and increase students' motivation to learn. Environmentalists also support substituting traditional textbooks with digital books on notebook computers as the latter can unquestionably save paper, which means that fewer trees need to be cut down. Parents also welcome this decision because the replacement can help
15 lessen the weight of their children's school bags.

[3] There are also criticisms to the use of e-books. Many teachers disapprove of the use of notebook computers because they are worried that students might be easily distracted by this gadget. It may shift the focus of learning from the teacher to the technology and this may affect students' learning effectiveness. For instance, students may browse other sites or use software
20 which is irrelevant to the teaching content in the lesson. It is therefore difficult for teachers to manage the class. 'I am also concerned about the learning attitude developed among students. From my experience, learning is more effective if students use their pens and pencils and do highlighting on printed books rather than simply clicking on a few buttons on the keyboard,' said Ms Ivy Tam, an experienced teacher. 'I am worried about teachers' readiness,' admitted Ms
25 Kwan, a school principal. 'We have a lot of experienced but less technologically-savvy teachers who are in the education field for over 20 years. They have been using printed books since their first day of teaching. It will be a drastic change for them if printed books are replaced. What if they cannot adapt to this change? This can affect students' learning in the end.' The principal pointed out that the implementation cost of e-textbooks on notebook computers is another major
30 concern. Additional and on-going operational costs associated with building Wi-Fi infrastructure, training teachers and administrators how to use the technology require a stable funding source.

It will be difficult for schools to implement e-learning programmes unless the government provides funding to help defray these expenditures.

[4] Another major criticism is raised by the physicians. Using e-books means that children have
35 to look at their monitors for a long period of time every day, which will result in a range of health problems, such as eyestrain, headaches and blurred vision.

[5] Obviously, there are pros and cons to this issue of concern. Having taken into consideration different parties' perspectives, there is still a way out. It might not be the right time to replace school textbooks with digital books on notebook computers completely, but schools should
40 consider letting students use both e-books and printed books. This allows more time for students and teachers to get used to different modes of learning. Students can then enjoy the benefits of learning with both tools; and teachers can prepare appropriate teaching and learning materials accordingly. After all, this change should not happen overnight but gradually.
